

Situation Report No. 4 Effects of Tropical Storm Sendong

Overview

On December 15, a tropical depression East of Mindanao has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility and was named “Sendong.” It later on developed into a tropical storm which was given an international codename Washi. “Sendong” exited the country December 18, hours after it made its second landfall in the vicinity of Puerto Princesa, Palawan.

According to PAGASA, Sendong dumped a total of 142 mm amount of rainfall in 12 hours, which is classified as “super heavy rainfall.” It was also said that the amount of rainfall is minimal as compared to Ondoy ([Manila Bulletin](#)).

Current Situation

In the wake of devastation of Tropical Storm Sendong, the government has declared State of National Calamity as the supplies are now running low. Upon the declaration of state of calamity, the price of basic commodities in the area freezes and is in effect for 60 days unless lifted. On the declaration of calamity, calamity funds of local and national government can now be used for disaster-hit communities. It would also “allow the government to give hazard pay to health, science and technological worker in the calamity areas ([ABS-CBN](#)).

In the 6AM Update of [NDRRMC](#), there are 338,415 individuals or 63,079 families affected. Fatalities have now exceeded the combined number of deaths brought by Ondoy and Pepeng. The death toll has now reached 957 while there are still 49 missing persons.

The amount of damage to agriculture is now pegged at an estimated P1.94M in the regions of CARAGA and Bicol. Regions XI, XII, and CARAGA have also reported damage to school facilities. As of reporting time, 14 schools have reported damages brought by the storm.

The storm also caused power interruptions in several cities and municipalities. In Negros Oriental, 70% of power has been interrupted due to destroyed power line of National Grid Corporation. Basic services such as communication, water, and transportation were affected due to power loss.

In Cagayan de Oro City, on the other hand, 60% of power has been restored as of 5PM, December 18.



As of today, there are 62 existing evacuation centers temporarily housing 42,733 individuals or 9,743 families in regions VII, X, XI, and CARAGA.

Meanwhile, news report says three of the areas hardest-hit by Sendong are the cities of Dumaguete, Iligan, and Cagayan de Oro. Below is the current status of the three cities.
